



Nina Haggerty Centre and Foundation explore partnership

The Nina Haggerty Centre was pleased to welcome Lenir Santos and Crispim Campos in early December. Paul Freeman met Lenir and Crispim in May of this year when he and Nicole Galellis travelled to Campinas Brazil to present at an international conference hosted by their organization.

The Fundação Síndrome de Down (Down Syndrome Foundation) of Campinas will be celebrating its 25 anniversary in 2010 and hopes to mark this milestone with the launch of an arts centre based on our work here in Edmonton. Lenir, President of the Foundation, was one of a group of parents of children with down syndrome who founded their organization.

The Nina Haggerty Centre and Foundation plan to create an Accord to maintain and further develop the partnership, wishing to explore the potential for joint projects and opportunities for collaboration.

Volunteer Program Gets a Boost


The Nina Haggerty Centre has hired Anna Rambow, a Centre volunteer and graduate of the MacEwan Arts & Cultural Management Program, to coordinate its volunteer program and support community liaison.

Anna will also be working part time for Arts on the Ave, beginning in February, to help coordinate next year's Kaleido Family Arts Festival. This creates an ideal opportunity to establish a shared position between the Nina Haggerty Centre and Arts on the Ave. Currently, Anna is working 10 hours a week for the Centre, supported by our 3-year

Edmonton Community Foundation Grant. The grant is intended to help the Centre strengthen its internal structures, including the volunteer program.

Last year, volunteers contributed over 1300 hours to operations, fundraising, public relations and management activities. - Rangefinders celebrates a 3-month low tech photography project, offered with support from the Lee Fund (Edmonton Community Foundation).

- Edmonton artists, Wenda Salomons and Candace Makowichuk have worked with artists from the Nina Haggerty Collective to explore new media. They have created lensless cameras made from boxes, developed photographs using sunlight and chemicals (cyanotype) and created Diazo prints.

The project also encouraged artists to explore the neighbourhood.

The work being produced is increasingly sophisticated and includes artist photos like the one below of Fay Frick. We are excited to unveil the exhibition in January. The show includes work by Candace and Wenda and will be reviewed by the Edmonton Journal.
